

School Crossing

On the 17/11/2016, I wrote to you to explain that the site that supports your school does not meet the national threshold as defined by Road Safety GB. We held a full public consultation where we received 790 responses to the consultation some were in favour of our recommended approach but mostly not.

On 24 January 2017 the Children's Services Committee discussed the public consultation regarding the future of the Road Crossing Patrol Service and made the decision **not** to proceed with the removal of sites that do not meet the threshold at the end of March this year . They voted to continue to operate as we do now, regularly monitoring sites and when our staff members offer their resignation or retires, we will make a decision whether or not to replace based on the monitoring evidence.

However this "decision" still had to be agreed at the full County Council meeting on 20 February 2017 as there was an impact on the Children's Services budget. That budget has now been agreed and the funding for 2017/8 confirmed.

As you know this in a non-statutory service that we do not have to provide; the responsibility for getting children to and from school sits with the parent or carer and not with the Road Crossing Patrol Service. I would strongly urge you to ask the Road Safety Team to provide awareness training for your pupils if you do not already do so; we all want the children and young people of Norfolk to be confident citizens, being able to cross a road safely any time of the day, any day of the week and any week of the year is really important for them.


